

Lebanon Township Police Department Installs New “Project Medicine Drop” Box to Help Residents Dispose of Unused Medications, Prevent Prescription Drug Abuse.

Lebanon Township Police Department announced that it has joined the New Jersey Attorney General’s “Project Medicine Drop” initiative, and has installed a Project Medicine Drop box at Police Headquarters.

Today’s announcement makes it easier and more convenient than ever for Lebanon Township residents to take an active role in the fight against the nationwide epidemic of opiate and heroin abuse, which often is fueled by the abuse of prescription painkillers.

Project Medicine Drop is a natural addition to our commitment to help improve the public safety and quality of life in Lebanon Township. It will encourage our residents to be fully aware of the potential for abuse presented by otherwise beneficial medications.

The departments’ new Project Medicine Drop box is located in the vestibule at police headquarters; 530 W. Hill Rd., Glen Gardner, NJ (Lebanon Township). Residents may visit the Lebanon Township Police Department at any time, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, to dispose of their unused or excess medications. This can be done anonymously and with no questions asked.
